

THREE THRESHERS WORKING IMBLER VICINITY NOW.

Average Wheat Crops Assured and the Threshers Showing 30 to 45 Bushels of Oats to the Acre-Imbler Farmers Are Elated-Other Items.

Imbler, Aug. 8 .- (Special.) -- Far ers are half through harvesting their oats, and with three threshing mathines working in the imemidate vicinity, there is no delay in sight. Farmers in this prosperous community are extremely happy. Their wheat has run from 30, in the lowest instances, to 43 bushels per acre, and thus far in the oats fields the threshers find the yield will run from 30 to 45 bushels.

Activity in harvest is not confined to the fields alone, but to the large granaries as well, for teams are daily hauling bushels by the hundreds to the elevators.

The crew which is repairing the mill recently purchased by the Imblet Flouring Mill company, is exerting all its energies to complete the work as rapidly as possible that the large quantities of wheat can be made into flour at once.


