TWO OLD PICTURES

About 25 years ago Gus Benglesdorf, of whom La Grande can boast of as a loyal citizen, sent two photographs of La Grande back east to his relatives. One showing the old town, now generally known as South La Grande, and what was then the new town. When these photos were taken there was a large amount of vacant land between the two, and Fourth street was more in fancy than reality.

The other picture shows Jefferson avenue and the railroad shops and round house. The old-timers will immediately recognize Wilber's livery stable which occupied the lot upon which is now the Union Building works. Porter's hotel was where the Mint saloon building now stands, or rather did prior to the June election. Kirtley's barber shop is recognized as a landmark by many and the Palace saloon building is the only building on the row that remains when the photo was taken.

A few hundred feet west of what is now the Fir street railroad crossing, were situated the stockyards.

The little depot building was on the opposite side of the track. The elevated coal bunkers were different. The cars did not enter it and the little switch engine which did the work then looks like a baby as well as do the box cars standing on a side track, as compared with those now in use.

The picture also shows the old creek or irrigating ditch which ran zig-zag through the city before the city covered it through the alley between Jefferson and Adams avenues. This section of Jefferson avenue was not graded and shows to what extent that portion of the city had to be filled to bring it to its present condition.

Mr. Benglesdorf recently sent for these photos and they may now be seen in the window of James R. Smith.
