He introduced Attorney Pickler of this city, who although not a student, consented to deliver an address on the "Value of House Study and the Study Habit."

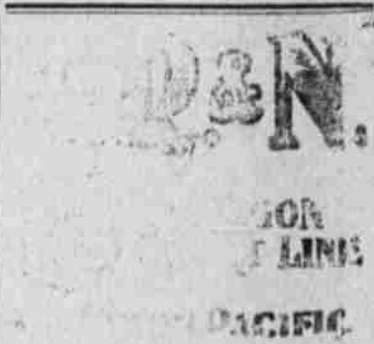
