Has Far-Sighted Purpose in Meeting Governor Chamberlain.

A report emanating from traveling men in this city is to the effect that E. H. Harriman, the Southern Pacific magnate spending his vacation at Pelican Bay, has no great revelations to make to Governor Chamberlain, but desires to win him over to the corporation view of American life, since he is certain to become a United States senator, says an Eugene paper. Har riman, it is said, feels that a great crisis is about to occur in the railroad affairs of the nation, and is far from certain that he will have enough United States senators in his hands to stave off the threatened storm.
