Manager Ramsey is now in Portland looking up markets, and as soon as sufficient quantities of the fruit ripen, the shipments will begin. The prune and peach business will sort of an introductory matter to the apple business, which will undoubtedly enjoy a prosperity here this year which has never been equalled before.

Freewater, Aug. 25.—Peach day will be observed at Freewater September 2, and those who participated in this event at Freewater last fall will be glad to know that the event is to be an annual one and will take place this year on Wednesday, September 2. Arrangements have been made for a big picnic for the people of Umatilla and Walla Walla counties. Those who are expected to be present are ex-Governor Moore, C. F. Whitney, Will M. Peterson, Judge Lowell, Congressman Ellis and others.

A complete list will be furnished later. Sports, games and other attractions in addition to the speaking will enliven the proceedings. A big exhibit of the products of this rich section will be in evidence.

Peaches and cream will be served free to all. This rich portion of Umatilla county is becoming the center of the peach industry for the inland empire, its output last year exceeding the widely advertised Yakima valley.

BUILD CEMENT BLOCK HOUSE.

Roscoe West About to Introduce New Residence Material Here.

The first cement-block residence in this city is now about to be constructed, the foundation having been finished and the machinery necessary for the construction of the blocks, soon to arrive. The structure is being built by Roscoe West on Walnut street, and is to be 26x40 feet. The peculiar part of the structure is that it is to be of cement blocks entirely, thus introducing a new class of residence architecture in this city. The type of building will be between a cottage and a bungalow and will be a very neat affair. In addition to the machinery now here with which to make the blocks, another machine is on the way, which will allow the construction of smaller blocks. It is believed by many that this system of house material will soon be extensively used. The residence is to be equipped with a well water system taken from the deep Reiland well, some distance away.
