YOUNG GIRLS LEAVE HOME

Last evening the police officers received word from Baker City to look out for three young girls who had concluded to quit the paternal roof and seek entertainment elsewhere. The girls had appropriated two horses belonging to one of the girls' father and the last seen of them they were between North Powder and Union, still going in the direction of La Grande. Late in the evening the father of one of the girls arrived in La Grande, and through the aid of the officers, discovered that they had spent the night in this city and had started out bright and early this morning in the direction of Hilgard. This morning Officers Carr and McLachlin took up the chase with the father and found the young ladies between here and Perry. The girls are not over 14 years of age. The three rode on two horses and did not seem to have any particular objective point in view. They claimed that they were simply tired of staying in one place and had decided to have a look at the country. Two of the girls were taken home by the father, and the other, the older one, will be sent home this evening. The children, for that is all they can be called, have been out since Sunday morning when they left home as their parents supposed, to take a short ride. They have caused their parents much worry and the telephone wires were kept busy in an attempt to locate them. One night they spent in a barn between North Powder and Union. Having no money they were compelled to ask for food along the way. When questioned as to why they were alone on the road, they gibbered their questioners that they were a part of a party traveling to Elgin, and that they had either gotten ahead of the balance of the outfit or had allowed their friends to pass them and therefore they were in reality lost, but hoped to locate their friends by telephone. It is to be hoped the girls have been taught a profitable lesson, and hereafter they will be more considerate of the feelings of their parents and more careful of their own personal safety.

CANNOT FLOAT LOGS.

McCully of Joseph, Makes Vain Attempt to Float Logs Down River.

Flora, Aug. 25.—The big raft of railway ties that W. D. McCully of Joseph attempted to take down Snake river last Saturday, out of the Grande Ronde, did not prove very successful. There were something over 1000 ties in the raft, and while the greatest care was taken in the preparing of the raft in the hopes that it could be delivered to its destination, the undertaking was nevertheless a failure, for when the Captain Lewis rapids were reached it went to pieces and the ties drifted out in the stream in all directions. Something like 700, however, were later recovered from along the banks and delivered to Lewiston, so that the raft was not altogether a loss. Robert Richards was one of Mr. McCully's assistants and he reports that the breaking of the rafts in the rapids already stated, made things pretty lively for a while, and reminded him of the time when he used to ride logs back in Wisconsin. This is the second attempt to drive logs down the Grande Ronde and Snake rivers during the past two years, the first proved a total loss and this one will not net the owner anything. It is not thought that Mr. McCully will undertake to bring any more ties out.
