The La Grande flouring mill will start next Monday morning, to be operated with one shift for a week or so and then to be run on night and day plans. Wheat is being received this week and everything will be in readiness for a prosperous run next week.

The Pioneer Flouring Mill company, which owns the La Grande mill, will have all of its mills running by next week, according to announcement of prominent men in the company. Included in the mills to start next week will be the mill at Imbler.
