HOUSTON IN GOOD TRIM

"Doc" Lincoln, who returned this morning from Portland, attended two of the games wherein Ash Houston performed as snorestop for Oakland in the Pacific Coast league against the Portland team. He reports that Ash is playing a splendid game and though his error column for Wednesday shows three errors, it was Ash's hit that scored the first two runs. Houston was a popular player on the La Grande team of the Inland Empire league, and demonstrates the caliber of the players which played under La Grande's colors. Johnnie (Kling) Fournier is playing with Aberdeen, the Northwest league leaders, and only recently scored a home run. Zimmerman is playing left field for Seattle. Ninety per cent of the players that were included in the La Grande lineup are now playing in bigger leagues.

BISHOP SCADDING RETURNS.

Attended the Lambeth Conference at Which 243 Bishops Were Present.

After an absence which caused him to wish longingly that he was home, Bishop Charles Scadding returned yesterday from a trip to England, says a Portland paper.

"My trip was purely a professional one," he said. "I went there to attend the Lambeth conference, which is one of the most important conferences in our church. It includes the attendance of all the bishops of the church of England, and there were 243 bishops present. Of that number there were 69 bishops from America.

"The Archbishop of Canterbury presided at the conferences, and I have an idea that his time was well occupied. He attempted to serve the entire number of bishops who were attending, and I think he had his hands full.

Bishop Scadding denied that any of the discussions assumed the form of a debate, and that the most important subjects discussed were of purely church interests. Bishop Scadding announced that three young clergymen had been engaged to assist him in Oregon. He did not state where they would be located, but left the inference that at least one of them would be installed in Portland and the others at other points in the state.

Bishop Scadding was in London during the Olympic games at the metropolis. He saw the Americans win the big events and his Americanism caused him to cheer the American youths with the other Americans who were at the stadium.

"I never saw a sporting event that aroused so much interest," he said. "But I never want to see another Marathon race. It is too much for me, and I am sure the finish of the recent race was too much for the average man."
