# BOOZE FRACAS AT ECHO

As an opening of a thorough-going campaign against the violators of the prohibition law of this county, six arrests were made in Echo yesterday, and all were placed under heavy bonds to appear for trial, says a Pendleton paper. Pilot Rock, it is said, is going to get it next and the fight is to be carried into every place in the county where law-breakers hold forth. There is a strong sentiment on the matter among the people of the county which is going to be felt this fall. It is said that the prohibition law is to be enforced regardless of the number or prominence of people who are sent to jail, or the cost which may be attached to the campaign.

In answer to the complaints sworn out for them yesterday by Asa B. Thomson and J. C. Hoskins, M. H. Gillett, who is the proprietor of the Echo hotel, and his three employees, Stone, Norman and Morrison, waved hearing and gave \$500 bonds each to appear before the grand jury, which meets next month.

W. D. Gillett, who owned a soft drink stand, and a man by the name of Frank Neace, who is working for him, were arrested also, and asked for a hearing, which will be given them at Echo next Friday. These men also were placed under \$500 bonds each to appear for trial.

The cases yesterday were heard before Justice of the Peace Scholl, and District Attorney G. W. Phelps appeared for the state. Judge James A. Fee represented the defendants, Gillette, Stone, Norman and Morrison.

As a result of the search made yesterday liquor was found in the Idle Hour which pretends to be a soft drink stand, and in the barroom of the Echo hotel. There is said to have been much drunkenness in the little town for some time and the officials of the town are co-operating with the citizens who are interested in enforcing the law. From the turn of affairs it seems that the offenders are to be brought to justice and the law made supreme.

### PAST PRESIDENT HOME.

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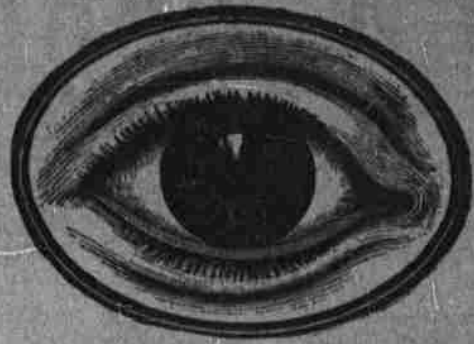
