Chico, Cal., Aug. 31.—A forest fire is raging north of here and has already burned 20,000 acres of timber and grazing land. Two hundred farmers are fighting it, but the struggle is made harder by a high north wind.

APPALLING DEATH LIST.

Trinidad, Col., Aug. 31.—Reports received here this afternoon indicate that 50 were killed in the flood at Folsom yesterday, which continues to rage. Survivors are reaching here and tell of how the buildings were swept away. Twenty-three bodies have been found and more are taken from the wreckage hourly. Scores are still missing.

DEMAND DUPONT'S RESIGNATION

As Members of Republican Executive Committee as He is Not Fit.

Wilmington, Del., Aug. 31.—A public demand for the resignation of General Dupont from the republican national executive committee was made here today by Alfred Corozier. The demand is based on Dupont's connection with the indicted powder trust. Corozier and Dupont are friends. Corozier says he took the action for the welfare of the party, but it is thought the wide publicity given Dupont's connection with the powder trust by Collier's Weekly brought the affair to a climax.

Mystery in London Society.

London, Aug. 31.—Detectives today announced their belief that a cross-eyed cockney, while picking hops, murdered the wife of Major General Charles Luard, in the woods near Seven Oaks a week ago. The Kent county constabulary differ, saying the woman was seen in the vicinity with a rifle, and was heard to fire a shot. One story is that a certain woman accused Mrs. Luard of alienating the affections of her husband.

The report here is that this woman is the wife of a high diplomat, who was seen in company with Mrs. Luard.

Schwab Caught Them Asleep.

Bethlehem, Pa., Aug. 31.—Employees of the Bethlehem Steel works were shaking in their boots today awaiting the outcome of a little visit paid to the works by Charles M. Schwab, the steel magnate and former president of the steel trust, in the curb of a woodsman. It is reported he saw several men asleep.

Tokio Exposition Postponed.

Tokio, Aug. 31.—The Tokio exposition has been postponed until 1917, according to an official statement issued today by the minister of agriculture and commerce. Action was taken over the protests of all members of the Chamber of Commerce, in accordance with the government's policy of retrenchment.
