SPENDS LIFE WITH REDMEN

FATHER DAMANI OF PENDLETON VISITED FATHER WHYTE

With 25 years spent among Indians as a mission priest, Father Damani of the Umatilla Indian reservation, who returned today to his work after a short visit with Father Whyte of this city, has ample material for a life's history of extreme interest. Father Damani is now at the head of that thriving mission near Pendleton, and his work is strenuous. He has a busy little school under his care, and he has a large following of Christians among the Indians, who show as great a devotion along religious lines as the primitive exhibited tact and adeptness in his hunting. Before coming to the Umatilla mission, Father Damani spent 23 years among the Indians of Montana and he came to Oregon well versed in the ways of the aborigines. It is not his imposing stature that wins to him the Indian's affection—for he is far below the average size—but it is his lode-stone like character that attracts and cements the friendship and trust of the ignorant Indian, among whom he spends his entire life.

RAILROAD ACTIVITY

BOTH HILL AND HARRIMAN LOOK TO CROOK COUNTY

Both Hill and Harriman have suddenly turned their attention to building a line from the Columbia into Crook county, says a Portland paper. Hill has purchased the controlling interest of the Oregon Trunk—a line projected up the Deschutes—and Saturday threw two crews of surveyors into the field. Harriman has already announced his intention of building into Central Oregon without loss of time. Both, evidently, are striving for the strategic entrance into the interior through the canyon of the Deschutes. His has threatened before to invade Harriman's preserves. The North Bank road was the first stroke. His apparent intention of immediate construction into central Oregon is believed to be the second stroke. Harriman also has two crews of engineers in the same field, and it is stated on authority that present activity fore-shadows as great a struggle for supremacy in central Oregon as witnessed Hill's successful and lightning-like efforts down the north bank of the Columbia.
