KERR PLANS NEW SCHEME

D. A. C. PRESIDENTS WILL AID EASTERN OREGON

Portland, Sept. 1.—The Journal said last night: If the plans of President W. J. Kerr of the Agricultural college, work out as he hopes and expects they will, eastern Oregon will blossom like the proverbial rose and in a few years be as important from an agricultural standpoint as is now the Hood River district.

President Kerr, who is in Portland and stopping at the Portland hotel, briefly explained his plan and outlined how he proposes to go about it to accomplish the hoped-for results.

He will probably start on this tour of inspection in about a week or 10 days and will be accompanied by two or three professors from the college, and possibly by two experts from the United States department of agriculture.

The eastern part of Oregon, President Kerr says, is rapidly settling up with farmers from the western part of the state and from other states. Many of these farmers are inexperienced in farming under the conditions which prevail in eastern Oregon.

"I have a plan outlined for the work but I prefer to say nothing about that until I have had an opportunity to go over the ground and see conditions as they are and find out what is needed. But my plan I think will cost the state almost nothing, for I believe we can get the department of agriculture to co-operate with us in the work and share the expense."
