COUNCIL MET LAST NIGHT

CHARTER ORDINANCE TO BE ACTED UPON WEDNESDAY.

Only Eight Arrests Made During the Month of August—Only One Case of Contagious Disease Covering a Similar Period—Ordinance Passed Establishing Grades on Certain Streets—Bills Audited and Recorder Busy Making Out Warrants.

All spectacular was eliminated at the council meeting last night, and it was strictly business from start to finish. The reports of the officers occupied careful attention.

The recorder's report shows that during the month of August water rents to the amount of \$1715.71, from fines and forfeitures \$35, and dog tags \$2.50.

The marshal's report shows that only eight arrests were made for the entire month and that there was only one contagious disease for the month, which speaks volumes for our healthful climate. Eight cows, one horse and two dogs were impounded during the month.

J. K. Wright offered a tract of land in Dwight's addition for a city dumping ground at the rate of \$50 per acre, which is under advisement.

The charter ordinance was read and referred for final action at the adjourned meeting to be held next Wednesday night.

There was another communication from the firm who sold the city the fire alarm hammer, with reference to payment for the same. So far the city has refused, claiming the apparatus is defective. One thing is certain, the service since it has been installed has never been satisfactory and the city has certainly did its part to make it work.

Several ordinances were introduced and one passed, establishing grades on certain streets.

The following bills were audited and the recorder is busy writing out the warrants today:

The George Palmer Lumber company offered to furnish the city 75,000 of sidewalk material at the rate of \$15 per thousand. The bid was accepted.

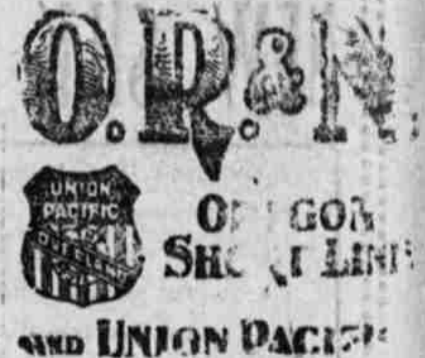
