Pendleton, Sept. 4 .- The East Oregonian said last night:

One of the most dastardly crimes his fown has ever suffered was committed last nigh when the Alta House and stable were maliciously set afire by an unknown wretch. By his act he imperfied the lives of a score of peo ple within the botel, burned eight orses to death and brought financial ruin to Sam Bitner, owner of the

The fire was started about 11:39 last night and the best witness to the circumstances surrounding the origin is Pete Schafer, a young man who was sitting with Miss Town on the front porch of the Johnnie Town home at the time. .

Firebug Was Seen.

According to Schafer,he and Miss Town saw a man come stealthily down the street from the side of the Alra House just a moment before the fire was seen. The fellow tip-toed until almost in front of the young people, whom he did not see, and he then broke into a run. On reaching Webb street he turned towards the business section, still running.

A Disastrous Blaze,

The fire was started in a shed between the Alta House and the feed stable. It was a shed in which slops from the hotel were placed and it connected the hotel with the stable. By reason of its location it was the ideal place for a man to start a fire if he wished to burn the stable and hotel.

From the little shed the flames spread rapidly to both the stable and the hotel, though the barn burned the faster. The barn extended from one end of the block to the other and the entire structure was an easy prey to the flames. Being of dry lumber and filled with hay, it burned like powder when the fire once gained headway. Eight Horses Burned.

When the fire started the big stable was completely filled with horses and vehicles. Nearly 80 head of horse were tied in the stalls, every stall eing taken. Those who arrived on the scene early shw the peril of the horses and rushed in to free them But the fire was so strong at the ex eme west end of the barn that help ould not reach the frantic animal and eight of them were burned in their stalls. By hard and plucky work or the part of eager volunteers the renainder of the horses were gotten oose and they ran out of the barn.

Alta House Destroyed. While the fire made slower head ay on the botel it was no less sur its destructiveness. Commencing t the southwest corner the flames ate heir way into the hostelry and within few minutes the old farm hotel was somed. Though some of the frame still standing, the ruin is worse than corthless. All inmates escaped safely.

Bitner Hit Hard.

Upon Sam Bitner, owner of the A! House and the stable, falls a heavyoss, and today Mr. Bitner has had incere sympathy from his friends and acquaintances. The hotel and stable with the entire contents was worth in he vicinity of \$20,000 and the propty was practically a total loss. He ad but \$4500 insurance upon the property and consequently had sufered a net less of about \$15,000.
