city today than the rumor of drowning coming from the coast. Late this afternoon the joyful tidings came from the dead, so-called, for Mrs. Biggers wires from Long Beach, two stations below Ocean Park, that "All is well." Rumors of the extreme alarm afloat in this city had reached her through relatives at Hillsboro who had been communicated with early in the day. In the hope of learning additional verification of the rumors of drowning. When the news reached here this morning from Mrs. Kaylor, the local Elks and the Eagles lodges kept the wires hot between here and the coast for information. Dr. Biggers is on the Minam fishing and two messengers will reach him practically at the same time.

### Drowning Theory Afloat.

Somehow, no one knows just how, the rumor is afloat that the three are victims of the sea. Mrs. Biggers, her daughter and her sister have been at Ocean Park, a summer resort on the Washington coast, which in reality is a part of North beach. The station is the first one north of The Breakers.

## CHOPPED WIFE'S BODY TO BITS

Boston, Sept. 4.—Chester S. Jordan today told Judge Wentworth how he killed his wife. He hacked her body to pieces with a razor and a butcher knife and planned to throw the parts of the remains into the ocean from a steamer, and then go to New York. He says he slept all night after killing the woman. He cut the body in pieces the following day. He said he quarreled with his wife, who struck him. He knocked her down stairs, where she was found dead. He put the hacked body in a trunk, which aroused the suspicions of the hackman.

### MYSTERIOUS MURDER.

Simmons, Who Killed Stanke Two Years Ago, Found Dead.

Boise, Sept. 4.—William C. Simmons, who shot and killed August Stanke two years ago, while quarreling over a line fence, was found dead in the barnyard today on his ranch in Highland valley. The body was covered with blood, indicating foul play. No examination of the body has been made, pending the arrival of the coroner. At the time he killed Stanke he wounded Louis Jaurnig, who was a witness against him. Simmons was acquitted, pleading self-defense.

### WALL STREET THINKING.

Southern Pacific to Expend \$50,000 in Extensions.

New York, Sept. 4.—Wall street is discussing the authentic report to the effect that the Southern Pacific is to expend \$50,000,000 completing 2000 miles of projected lines. The money is to be raised before 1910.

### A New Incident.

Portland, Sept. 3.—To give President E. H. Harriman a chance to see what a stockholders' meeting of the O. R. & N. really looks like, the directors of the corporation met in annual session at noon today, for the purpose of electing a new set of directors for coming year, but adjourned for one week. This was done primarily to give Mr. Harriman an opportunity to be present, as he is expected to be in the city several days next week. The members of the board also thought it was only common courtesy to the "Wizard of Wall Street" to defer action, in as much as he owns all but about 15 shares of the stock and has been so busy that he hasn't been able to attend a meeting in the entire history of the road; in fact, since its organization in 1896.

### Chicago Girl Kidnaped.

Chicago, Sept. 4.—Golden Anderson, aged 3 years, son of William Anderson, assistant auditor of the Illinois Steel company, was kidnaped here today, while playing in front of his home. It is supposed he is being held for a large ransom. A woman saw a strange man drive up, seize the boy and drive away. A general alarm was given.
