ATHLETES ARE COMING

DUE IN LA GRANDE TOMORROW MORNING
Kelly Will Reach Baker Tonight, and Will Be Joined Saturday by Smithson and Gilbert—Plans Miscarary for Jubilee in Baker City.

No one went to Baker City this morning to attend the proposed festivities in honor of the Oregon athletes, for the obvious reason that the athletes are not yet in Baker City. Dan Kelly will reach Baker City tonight and will remain there over night, joining the other two tomorrow morning. The trio will pass through La Grande tomorrow morning on No. 1, unless the present schedule is dodged. They are due in Portland tomorrow night. The Baker City Herald says of the matter:
There is considerable disappointment among the local admirers of the Oregon stars in the recent Olympic games and the many friends of Daniel J. Kelly, that it will be almost impossible to have a banquet for them as Gilbert and Smithson will not stop off in Baker City, and Kelly will not arrive until tomorrow night on the west-bound train. Instead of tomorrow morning as was thought and planned. The reason for this is not known, but a telegram from W. J. Petrain, sporting editor of the Oregonian, who was chosen to accompany the athletes from New York to Portland, states that Kelly should arrive in this city tomorrow night. The trains have been running late for some time and when Kelly arrives in the city it may be late to show him a good time.
It is planned, however, by the Baker Athletic club to present Kelly with a loving cup as a token of this club's high esteem for this famous athlete. The cup is silver, with three sterling silver handles, and gold lined, and has the following inscription upon it:
"Presented to Daniel J. Kelly by Baker Athletic Club, September 11, 1908. Victor in Olympic games, London."
