In a moment Wilson was out of his machine and drawing his gun, got within a short distance of Anderson before he was seen. When he called to the fugitive to surrender the latter took a glance at the pistol and gave up.

Anderson is being held in the county jail as a witness against Grant, who is charged with robbing stores at Athena.

GOVERNMENT HUNTERS ACTIVE.
Boise National Forest Hunters Bag Large List of Destructive Animals.

Washington, Sept. 12.—Uncle Sam's professional hunters and trappers, who have been assigned to rid the range of predatory animals, are apparently "on the job."

Hunter Breidenstien, employed on the Boise national forest, Idaho, killed 248 coyotes, six wildcats and one bear during the past season.

Conservative estimates by stockmen place their losses each year by each animal at \$100. Therefore, in this instance alone, the hunter saved in one national forest stock valued at more than \$25,000, at a cost to the government of \$1195, the amount of his salary.

The hunters are under the jurisdiction of the forest service.
