## HUGHES OPPOSED ON EVERY HAND

affairs of the legislature during the past winter, and the forces that are opposed to him are here today. The racing interests are doing everything possible, it is reported, to defeat the governor.

Black and Choate will be put forward by leaders who fear Root is too weak on account of his record as counsel for the trusts and the bitter attacks upon him by Hearst.

### Root Answers Bryan's Cry.

Root's acceptance speech devoted little attention to Hughes, being entirely confined to a discussion of the national issues. He insisted that the nomination of Hughes be made "in such a way that New York will surely cast the electoral vote for the republican candidate for the presidency."

Taking up Bryan's campaign cry, "Shall the people rule?" Root said the real trouble with the democrats is that the majority would not rule, for they cannot rule because they are in the minority in congress.

### Roosevelt to His Aid.

Oyster Bay, Sept. 14.—President Roosevelt came powerfully to the support of Hughes for renomination by the issuance of the following statement:

"The president has been in communication with Root and Congressman Cocks, regarding the governorship, and has authorized them to state, while he does not intend to dictate to the convention, that to all friends to whom he has spoken about the matter, he has used the strongest terms to favor renomination of Hughes."

Cocks represents Oyster Bay. Two years ago he delivered the message from Roosevelt to the state convention which resulted in the nomination of Hughes the first time.

## APPEAL ON FISH LAWS

Portland, Sept. 14.—An appeal to the supreme court of the United States to determine the validity of the Oregon initiative fishing laws is the last resort of Washington shore fishermen on the Columbia river, and pending the result of this appeal a temporary injunction will be asked for from the United States court forbidding the enforcement of the obnoxious law until the question of its constitutionality is decided. This outline of the procedure which Governor Mead of Washington, said would begin after his conference with Chamberlain yesterday in this city.
