## LIGHTNING HITS PLANT

### COVE POWER PLANT SUSTAINS BIG DAMAGE.

Electric Storm of Last Night Raised Havoc With Telephones and Did Damage at Cove to the Amount of \$600—Local Plant Shut Down Early This Morning.

An electric storm that blew out fuses for both the Pacific States and the Independent Telephone companies, and did \$600 damage to the power plant at Cove, visited the valley last evening, ceasing for a few hours, only to break out afresh again this morning at an early hour. Telephone communications were cut off last night when the electric storm broke, but the damage done to the telephones are trivial compared with the havoc rained at the Cove plant of the Grande Ronde Electric company. A bolt of lightning burned out the oil switch and threw the plant out of commission. Fortunately the parts burned to a crisp by the lightning could be duplicated from the home office, and about 9 o'clock local electricians went to Cove by team, and after working all night, put the plant in working order this morning. The Hot Lake sanatorium was in darkness a portion of the night, and when the second storm broke here early this morning, the power plant at Mill creek canyon was shut down. The sub-station on Washington avenue in this city, was a blaze of colored lights during the severest part of the storm.

While the thunder and lightning in this city was more severe than usual, it was weak compared with the severity of the storm in the Cove and Union districts.

## WHEAT GOES 54 BUSHELS

### EIGHT NEW HOUSES IN IMBLER THIS FALL

Heavy Rainfall in Imbler Last Evening and Threshing at a Standstill—Live News Items Compiled Today.

Imbler, Sept. 15.—(Special.)—Aside from the five new structure that are rapidly taking shape and will soon be completed, adding much to the evidence of thrift in this little town, three additional residences are to be built at once by the Summerville Lumber company. The houses will be built as tenement structures.

A heavy rain fell here last night, putting a damper on threshing for a few days. But the farmers are taking advantage of the cessation of the thresher's hum to sow their fall wheat and practically all the farmers are devoting their time today to that feature of their work. Threshing is well advanced but there are still several large jobs to complete before harvest is over.
