GRAIN SHIPPERS OBJECT.

Farmers Depending on O. R. & N. to File Wheat Rate Complaint.

Grain shippers on the main line of the O. R. & N. railroad, between Halmes and Seuferts, and upon the Pilot Rock, Elgin, Shaniko, Heppner, Condon branches and the Washington division in Oregon and Portland, have filed a complaint with the railroad commission against the existing schedule of rates and ask that a reduction of at least 49 per cent be made by the commission, after formal hearing of same has been had, says a Salem paper.

This complaint is made in the name of George Peebler of Pendleton, through attorneys James A. Fee and R. J. Slater, and embodies practically the same allegations as those set forth in the complaint made by the railroad commission, upon its own motion, and hearings have already been set for Pendleton, September 28, and Wasco, September 22. This complaint comes too late to be made a part of the Pendleton hearing because of the time limit fixed by law in which formal notification shall be made to the defendant railroad companies before a hearing can be set.

Prohibit Near Beer.

The city council passed the following ordinance last evening in reference to the sale of non-intoxicating malt liquors. In talking upon the ordinance, Colonel Williams said it was so difficult to enforce the provisions of the local option law when this near beer is being sold, it was a necessity that it be passed. He also said the charter gives the council the right to pass such an ordinance.—Eugene Guard.
