HOME FROM METROPOLIS

Equanimity reigned at the meeting of Taft clubs in Portland yesterday, and the hatchet is buried until the presidential campaign is over at least, according to County Chairman J. H. Peare who returned this morning from the metropolis, where, with other delegates from the local Taft-Sherman club, he attended yesterday's meeting.

La Grande's delegation to this meeting in Portland yesterday consisted of County Chairman Peare, W. J. Snodgrass and Fred B. Currey, secretary of the local Taft-Sherman club. Two of these were given honors by the 70 members present, in that Snodgrass is first vice-president of the state federation of clubs, and J. H. Peare was temporary chairman and had in his hands the appointment of preliminary committees, a matter of deep importance to the welfare of the meeting.

When the meeting was fairly organized the constitution and by-laws committee decided to appoint presidents from every county in the state, and Lucius Wright of Union bears that distinction from Union county.

That there was no conflict between the two factions which in reality exist in the state, but whose paths diverge at obstacles other than those of the presidential campaign, was plainly evinced by the selection of a Fulton man, Kalpi, as permanent secretary.

Mr. Peare is home, determined to spread Taft gospel and prognosticates a 25,000 to 30,000 majority for Taft in November.

Huffman Goes to Alberta. Bert Huffman, editor of the Pendleton East Oregonian, left today over the O. R. & N. for Calgary, Alberta, where he will let a contract to have a section of new land just purchased near there, broken for a crop next spring.
