The new charter, after legalizing or rather recognizing our \$25,000 city hall bonds, our \$50,000 water bonds and our \$160,000 bonds-to-be for the Beaver creek project, limits the indebtedness to 10 per cent of our taxable property. The above stated amounts total \$235,000, and an additional 10 per cent of our taxable property gives us a margin of a little in excess of \$100,000 additional.
