BENNETT HERE

Preliminary motions were argued before Circuit Judge Knowles in the England-O. R. & N. case this morning. In this case Charles England, a former car repairer of this city, is suing the O. R. & N. for \$50,000 damages for injuries sustained in the local yards. This is the first legal set-to in the case which is expected to consume much time in disposal.

Attorney Bennett of The Dalles appeared for the plaintiff, and made the preliminary arguments, while C. E. Cochran appeared for the defendants.

THREE TRUE BILLS.

The Grand Jury Returns Indictments Against Three Alleged Criminals.

Baker City, Sept. 22.—The Herald said last night:

Although it was Monday afternoon the grand jury recently drawn at Judge Smith's request, returned three true bills indicting Frank Tucker for burglary, J. E. Williams for assault with a dangerous weapon and Perry Mickel for assault.

Frank Tucker is the character who received prominence at the time of the Harvey Brown tragedy when he stated that he had been camped near the parties supposed to have committed the crime.

J. E. Williams is held for shooting a man at Richland some time ago. The man who was shot did not die, however, which may make the case against Williams easier.

Perry Mickel has a plain case of assault against him and will be tried on that charge.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, the 24th day of November, 1908, a special election will be held of the voters of the City of La Grande, Union county, Oregon, and that the polls will be open from the hour of 8 o'clock a. m. until the hour of five o'clock p. m. of said day.

Said election is called by order of the Council of the City of La Grande for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the people of the City of La Grande the approval and adoption of certain amendments to the charter of the city of La Grande as shown by the proposed charter heretofore approved by the council of the City of La Grande by ordinance No. 392, Series 1908, and filed with, and in the office of the recorder of the city of La Grande, on the 16th day of September, 1908.

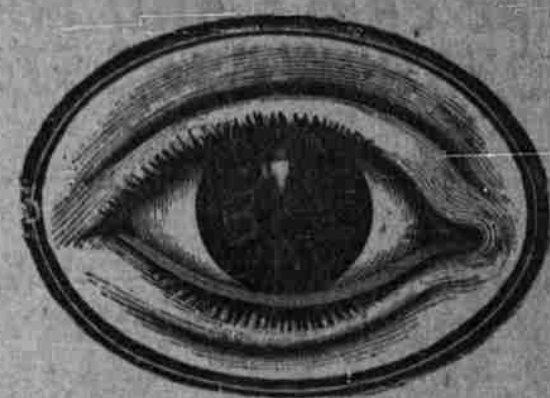
