## LEWIS GOES TO THE JAIL

The attention of Justice Stewart was occupied this morning with the case wherein George Lewis was charged with entering a box car and taking therefrom a couple bottles of whisky, from a barrel which was being transported by the company. The evidence was sufficient to warrant the justice in placing him under bonds to appear before the next term of the circuit court. The state was represented by District Attorney Ivanhoe, and Lewis by Attorney Eugene Ashwell. The bonds were placed at \$500, and not being able to gather up the required amount, Lewis is now in the county jail.

### DEMANDS A REPLY

This correspondence is not merely justified in a striking fashion of the action of the administration, but also a serious rebuke on the attacks upon the administration of both the Denver convention and in Bryan's campaign. As the selection of Haskell as chairman of the resolutions committee at Denver, and also as treasurer of the national committee had my approval and endorsement, I feel it my duty to demand immediate investigation of the charge which is endorsed by the president of the United States, your high position, as well as your sense of justice, would prevent your sanctioning such a charge unproved. I respectfully request you to furnish proof that you possess, or if you have none, I request you to indicate a method by which the truth may be ascertained."

## TEST ACTION OF JUSTICE

The legality of action by the justice court in the case of Dr. Stevenson of this city, charged with practicing dentistry without a license, will be tested in a decision on arguments in a writ of review before Judge Knowles this afternoon. The case has been appealed to the circuit court, and the defense is now testing the legality of certain steps taken by the justice court. The arguments have been taken under advisement. Attorney C. E. Cochran appears for the defendant.

### Campaign Funds.

"We welcome Mr. Taft to this advanced ground," said Mr. Bryan in one of his numerous interviews since the Denver convention. The ground referred to is Mr. Taft's statement that no campaign contributions would be received from corporations. Mr. Bryan intended to convey the impression that Mr. Taft had come to that determination after the Denver convention. In that the Democratic "peerless one" is not honest. Mr. Taft is a law abiding citizen. Such contributions are unlawful, made so by a law passed by a Republican congress at the instance of a Republican administration of which Judge Taft was a part, six months before the Denver convention. Be honest, Mr. Bryan, if you can!

### Bryan's Precinct Republican.

At the recent primary election in Nebraska Lancaster Precinct No. 4, in which is located Fairview, the voting precinct of W. J. Bryan, cast thirty-five Republican votes and twenty-six Democratic. The same precinct last fall cast forty-three Republican votes and thirty-five Democratic, a Democratic loss of slightly more than 1 per cent. When Mr. Bryan lived in town he registered in Precinct A of the Fifth Ward, a polling place which usually could be depended upon to vote about the proportion of three Republicans to one Democrat. At the time he removed to Fairview he remarked jocularly that he was going to a community where the political division was more even, and he hoped in time so to reform Lancaster No. 4 as to make it veer around to his way of thinking.
