NEW AUTO-STAGE.

Driver From Portland to Be the Operator of Joseph Stage Line.

The auto-stage between Wallowa town and Joseph is in running order this morning. The McCully stage line has purchased a monster auto of the Thomas make, and of 90 horse power. It accommodates nine passengers, but can readily be made to give room for more than that. It takes the place of the regular stage between Joseph and Elgin and has its terminus where the Wallowa extension has its terminus. A chauffeur from Portland arrived in the city this morning on his way to Joseph, and he will be the modern "stage driver" from now on until the railroad is finished. The auto-stage and the advent of the railroad has made travel to Joseph both speedy and pleasant, compared with the primitive method.

Fruit Men Organize.

Walla Walla, Sept. 22.—An organization which promises to mark an epoch in the history of the fruitgrowing industry of the Walla Walla valley was effected yesterday afternoon, when more than 50 fruitgrowers met at the court house and banded themselves together in a preliminary meeting to work for the better prices on fruits and fight any advances that may be made in freight charges. Although the gathering yesterday was only a preliminary event the final outcome is expected to take in a broader and wider scope of work than is at present to be undertaken.
