Tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock commences the second annual aster show in this city, and from that hour until 10 in the evening, with a brief interval at supper time, the aster show will be in full swing. The committee wants asters, and, in fact, must have asters. This should not be taken to mean that there is a dearth for the plant, for there isn't, though great abundance means greater degree of success.

Refreshments Served.

Pretty girls will serve refreshments to the visitors tomorrow afternoon and night. From one table will be served ice cream, while a sister table will be laden with refreshments of a warm nature, such as coffee and chocolate.

There is every indication that the coming aster show will be a gorgeously successful thing. On the eve of the day climatic conditions indicate favorable weather. The show will be held in the K. of P. hall on Adams avenue, and the city should not allow the opportunity slip to visit a veritable beauty place tomorrow afternoon or evening, when the asters will be on exhibit.

There will be no door fees and no charge for entries in the competitive exhibits.

to Haskell from blame. "I cannot exonerate Haskell," he said, "of the charge of being implicated in collecting the \$500,000 bribe fund by the Standard to bribe me to stop proceedings against the company. Neither can I condemn him; all I know is hearsay. I have the statement of Charles Squire that Haskell is one of the three men who raised the fund. I insist that the grand jury investigation would show just what was done, and who is guilty. Squire gave me Haskell's name January 25, 1899."

UNCOVER PLOT

Los Angeles, Sept. 22.—Five men are under arrest, leads the government agents to the belief that after a year's search they are at last on the trail of an organized band of smugglers engaged in running Asiatics into the United States over the Mexican border. Jesse D. Button, proprietor of a livery stable; G. J. Patch, manager of an auto garage were arrested last night following their indictment. Obligations of Civil War.
Money indebtedness is not the only obligation we incurred and assume in the great civil war. There was a still greater debt, an everlasting obligation that could never be paid in full. But in the years that have followed the Republican party has inaugurated and developed pension laws under which over three and one-half billion dollars have been paid to disabled veterans or to the survivors of those who gave their lives for their country and their flag. This pension system, a product of the policy of the Republican party, has no precedent in history and is equal in justice and generosity among the nations of the earth.—Hon. James S. Sherman.
