## PORTLAND NEWS LETTER

Portland, September 28.—(Special correspondence.)—The Portland Commercial club finished its new building with Oregon or Douglas fir, and in addition to this used this same exquisitely grained wood in making some high-class permanent furniture for its main parlor. Nine out of 10 visitors admire it more than they do mahogany. During the visit of E. H. Harriman he requested that samples be sent him for the consideration of his architects who are now building his country home, which will probably be the finest residence in America. Last Saturday President B. L. Winchell, of the Rock Island system, made a visit to the club and particularly admired this same wood. He gave notice to an official of the Harriman lines who was present, that if they didn't hurry the Rock Island would have the first dining car or sleeper finished in the chief wood of the Pacific northwest—of which there is sufficient yet left to turn out more and richer millionaires than has the iron and steel district of which Pittsburg is the center. Edward Ertz of Devonshire, England, member of the Society of British Royal Artists and of international reputation, heard so much about the beauties of the Pacific northwest that he is now making a very leisurely stay in this region. The Columbia river, Crater lake and other famous scenic attractions of the North Pacific coast, he says, have no equal.

A meeting of the representatives of all the Pacific coast commercial bodies will be held in San Francisco on Monday, October 5. There will be delegates in attendance from several of the important organizations of Washington and Oregon. On Tuesday morning opens in the same city for a five days' session, the Trans-Mississippi Commercial congress, which gives promise of being one of the most successful gatherings of that influential body. Delegations from Washington and Oregon are materially increased by the fact that the congress has held meetings in both Portland and Seattle.

Don't allow the political campaign now on to make you overlook the colonist rates in effect during September and October, and remember that your friends and acquaintances throughout the older states can come to any part of the Pacific northwest on one-way tickets at less cost now than at any other time during the coming winter. Vancouver, Wash., one of the old pioneer towns made famous by having General Grant and General Sherman located at the barracks there, is giving some of the newer towns a sample of civic enterprise. Not satisfied with putting down hard-surfaced pavements, on last Saturday they celebrated the completion of an electric street railway system, which reaches well into the suburbs.

### FOURNIER WITH PORTLAND.

Former La Grande Catcher Secures Position in Coast League.

Johnnie Kling, alias Fournier, who caught for La Grande the past season, has been sold by the fast Aberdeen club of the Northwest league, to Manager McCredie of the Pacific Coast league. He will report with McCredie on the 10th of October. This is a warranted jump for the clever catcher and is additional proof that La Grande had players in its team which were of the first caliber. Local fans have always predicted that Fournier would land in the big leagues. The sale price was an even \$1000.
