

POSSIBLE JOSEPH WILL NOT BE TERMINUS LONG

By Continuing Wallowa Extension 20 Miles After it Reaches Joseph, a Water Grade to the Coast From La Grande Would Be Established-La Grande Then Terminus for a Large

The Sunday Oregonian has this to say on a matter of vital interest to La Grande:

ension will eventually be pushed east and north to a connection with the Northwest rallroad, the line now under construction from Huntington along the Snake river to Lewiston. This also is a Harriman road, which is taking advantage of the water grade along the Snake river canyon to reach Lewiston and will make a route of easy grades for freight operation for overland traffic.

The new Wallowa extension is a water-grade route and with the connection yet to be built to the Snake river line, an alternate route from Huntington to La Grande will be offered that will have all the advantages of a water grade, with the minimum of curvature and grades. This will save the haul over the mountains that is now necessary on heavy freight trains and will undoubtedly be taken advantage of for the operation of everything except passenger trains.

Water-grade routes in a mountainous country are prime essentials for railroads that handle heavy freight trains and all such avenues for traffic in the Pacific northwest are oming eageriy selzed up by both the Hill and Harriman lines. Although the extension from Joseph to the Snake river, a distance of only about 29 miles, has not yet been authorized by the O. R. & N., it is expected by railroad men that this piece of road will be one of the early pieces of construction undertaken by that company.
