MAURICE FITZMAURICE

CHARGED WITH LIBEL

NEW TROUBLES MEET FORMER LA GRANDE PREACHER.

Maurice Fitzmaurice in Jail at Lewiston Charged With Criminal Libel—Denies His Guilt, Saying Others Wrote Faulty Editorial in His Paper.

Maurice Fitzmaurice, the effulgent legal, literary and lecturing light, whose glory was reflected upon La Grande for a short time last year, is now in trouble at Lewiston, Idaho, where he is fighting Washington authorities who desire to take him back to Garfield county, Washington, to answer to a charge of criminal libel brought by the editor of a rival paper. The story of Fitzmaurice's troubles is thus told by a Lewiston dispatch: Maurice O. Fitzmaurice, editor of the Garfield County Standard, is under arrest here on a charge of criminal libel, complaint having been filed by H. C. Benbow, editor of a rival paper in Garfield county, Washington. Fitzmaurice will resist extradition, but in the meantime he will be held in the county jail here, pending application for the writ.

Fitzmaurice carries letters from prominent Irish business men, one of them being a letter from the lord mayor of Dublin, where Fitzmaurice formerly resided. Benbow, it is said, will prosecute Fitzmaurice for criminal libel, based on an editorial in which the Standard charges Benbow with being the leader of a band of cattle rustlers.

Fitzmaurice denies all knowledge of the editorial, which, he says, was written during his absence and without his consent. He owns stock in the two papers and his name as editor appears in the Pomeroy paper. The arrest is said to be the climax of a sensational political campaign, in which Fitzmaurice has supported Senator Levi Ankeny and his friends and fought Jones, Cosgrove and their supporters.
