TEAM HOLDS SCRIMMAGE

The first real scrimmage to be gone into by the high school football squad this season, was indulged in last evening, and Coaches Wall and Mickleson have no complaint to make at the outlook. Every candidate for the "Varsity" is working with a will and places on the team, will be fought for with much ginger.

It is very likely that some kind of a practice game will be played between the local team and a team from Island City next Saturday afternoon. At that time the coaches will get a fair eye on what the men can do under action and practically every player in the squad will be given a try-out at that time. If the practice game falls through, Cove will be the first team to face the locals this year.

The coaches are especially pleased with the spirit that seems to animate the work of each candidate. It is the kind that makes winning teams. Thus far the work has been confined to signal practice on simple plays, the forward pass being tried but little. As a rule the new play is a dangerous proposition and few teams of the coast will depend on it as a ground-gaining medium.

Many After Places.

At present V. Bolton, the dependable end, is out of the game, but he hopes to be-out in a suit in a few weeks. This leaves the race for the end now between Rice, a player of last year, who shows marked improvement, Williamson, a speedy man of the track team; Green, a man who played with Red Wing, Minn., last year; Cecil Bolton and Harold Grady, two light fellows with considerable speed. The finish in this department of the game will be interesting as the end positions are highly important places on a team in modern football.

For tackles Zurbrick, Funk and Ingles are showing up the strongest. Grout, L. Williamson and Borders are out after the guard positions, while Bean will be the center rush to all appearances now, though he has no guarantee to hold the job all season. At the helm, quarterback, there is going to be the liveliest fight of any, very likely. Charles Reynolds, Stoddard and Willie Peare have the qualities requisite, and while Reynolds is the only one of the trio with any great amount of experience to help him, the others have agility and cool-headedness so great a factor in that responsible position. Just who will take the rudder in the first game, is yet undecided.

In the back field there is also more competition than usual. The team misses Bacon in the full position, but Heidenreich and Geddes are capable men for successors. Geddes has a "booting" leg of considerable worth, which will pull for the place strongly. Heidenreich's strength and skill offset this in a measure, hence the indecision at present as to the eventual occupant of that place. In the halfback positions Hamilton is back and if he shows his speed of last year, should have a cinch on one of the halves. Carpy and Captain Myers will fight it out also for the half position. Meyers will be expected to win points with his sole-leather this season. His nervousness of last year will be remedied and the coaches believe he will show marked adeptness in that greatest of all departments, kicking.

He has ability seldom seen in a boy of his years, but heretofore has not had the coolness of nerve to execute in a game like in practice. But the captain and his coaches are positive the weaknesses are overcome, and the score sheet at the end of the season will show where Myers has won many points with his boot and straight ball playing.
