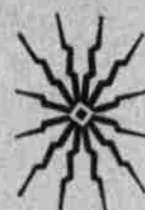

SITUATION IS RELIEVED

During the past week the coal situation from a standpoint of O. R. & N. supply, has been materially relieved. Already several trainloads have passed through the city and the O. R. & N. bins here have been replenished to a certain extent.

The relief came when striking miners in Montana returned to work several weeks ago, but it is only during the past few days that the relief has been felt here. The coal movement has had a tendency to renew and revive business activity in O. R. & N. circles, with the result that practically all the power in the local round house has been put into service.

No Relief Commercially.
 While the railroad companies have been rushing coal over the state for their own use, La Grande coal dealers are no more able to fill orders today than they were last Saturday. They have not even been informed as to when relief will come. However, they are optimistic, as the carriers are evidently supplying themselves with fuel that they can maintain traffic for the relief of commercial centers later.

Missouri State Fair.
 Sedalia, Mo., Oct. 3.—Sedalia is prepared to show the Missourians who are beginning to gather here today, the greatest state fair they have ever visited, and one that will compare favorably with the best of similar exhibitions in other states. Installation of exhibits is about completed and the fair is now practically complete and in readiness for the unprecedented crowds expected next week. Many improvements have been made during the last year at the handsome permanent grounds of the fair association, and the track has been put into first-class condition for the speed program.

To Work Gold Coin Mine.
 Thomas W. Ayers, the prominent Pendleton druggist, is authority for the statement that the Gold Coin mine near Durkee, in which he is heavily interested, will again be worked. The Gold Coin is one of the ill-fated mines of eastern Oregon. After the mine had been practically opened a law suit closed it because of alleged damage by tailings in the water ruining some farm land belonging to one Brown. After the litigation was settled a new mill was placed in running order and after returning \$1200 to the owners in a short time, the mill was destroyed by fire, probably of incendiary origin. The nature of the rock is decomposed granite and can be worked as a placer, the canal for conveying the water being about one-third completed.

Congress of Italians.
 Rome, Oct. 3.—A "home coming" of Italians who have settled in the colonies and in foreign lands will be held in Rome during this month and November, and many loyal sons of the sunny kingdom have already returned to the land of their birth to take part in the congress and tell of their attempts to achieve fortune in other lands. Many prominent Italians from both North and South America are here and others are expected later. Senator Tittoni, minister of foreign affairs, called the congress, which is under the auspices of the Italian government with the king as its honorary president. A large colonization scheme will be considered by the congress. It is proposed to acquire 25,000 acres of land in Texas or elsewhere and to send Italian immigrants there, equipped with utensils and supplied with cattle and seeds.

A few years ago all precincts in this part of the Willamette valley were the homes of many ring-necked pheasants, says the Brownsville Times. Today they are scarce, almost unto extinction. The scarcity is largely due to the slaughter of the splendid game birds by the city sportsmen during the first 10 days of open season.
