#### FAIR ON SUNDAY.

Walla Walla Attraction Continues Until Next Sunday Night.

Walla Walla, Oct. 5.—(Special.)—Although Walla Walla's fair, which opened this morning, has been advertised to close on Saturday night, October 17, it will in reality be open until Sunday night following, as arrangements just completed make it possible to keep the fair open an additional day. Getting the idea from the fact that a large number of people always visit the fair grounds on the day following the fair, the management conceived a plan for keeping it open on this day, and making overtures to the people to visit the fair for an additional day.

As a fitting program for the day the large choir of St. Paul's Episcopal church has been secured to render a musical program of a sacred nature during Sunday afternoon. This choir is conceded to be one of the best in this section of the state. It contains 30 voices under direction of Prof. A. C. Jackson, in charge of the Whipple Conservatory of Music.

A large sum of money is expended annually by St. Paul's church, in bringing together the best talent in the Garden City for its choir, and as a result it is not outclassed by any musical body in the northwest.

The exhibits in the pavilion will also be kept in place on this day, and aside from the races, the fair will be

open just the same as on a week day.

#### ARMED FORCES.

Milton Ranchers Draw Arms and Form Line for Skirmishes.

Walla Walla, Oct. 4.—A special to the Bulletin from Milton, says:

Two camps of armed men are being maintained near Milton, according to word brought here today, and bloodshed is threatened unless the parties hiring these men come to some agreement. The trouble is over water.

The Peacock Mill company, it is asserted, put in a dam in the Walla Walla river and turned the water into an irrigation ditch. Miller & Sons, owners of a large orchard, promptly tore out the dam. The mill company built another and this in turn was destroyed. Then the armed camps were established and neither side is doing anything.

The men in the parties are armed with rifles and threaten to shoot members of the enemy's party if they do anything. The courts may be called on to decide the question.

The ranchers in the Freewater country, north of Milton, have long since abandoned the Little Walla Walla river as a source of supply for irrigation purposes. Water being found at from 15 to 20 feet, nearly all the fruitgrowers have installed electric or gasoline pumps, thereby insuring an abundant supply of water at all times without depending on the river, and also obviating the necessity of retaining a lawyer to defend their water rights.
