MEN AND TEAMS WORK

The week opened this morning with an unusual amount of building evidence on Jefferson avenue. Masons are laying the stone foundation for the new Bolton & Bodmer implement house, and a large crew of men went to work on the M. & M. company lot in the rear of the La Grande National bank building, where considerable excavation will be done.

At the latter place several teams and a large crew of men broke ground early in the day for what will next spring be a modern brick building. The sidewalk has been torn away, dirt wagons are moving and there is a hurry and hustle that means business. Contractor Kreiger has the contract for excavation and also the construction of the basement and the foundation. The basement must be completed and the foundation ready for the structure itself, by the first of April of next year. Mr. Kreiger states that there are several thousand cubic yards of ground to remove before the foundation and basement wall can be built.
