DELINQUENT AFTER TODAY

LAST OPPORTUNITY TO
MAKE HALF-PAYMENTS TODAY

Those Who Paid Half Their Taxes Last Spring Have Until Tonight to Complete Payments—Heavy Penalty and Interest Required After This Evening.

Today was the last day in which to pay taxes. Those who deposited half their taxes with the tax collecting department last April were given until today to complete the payment and unless such is done by tonight, the delinquents will have to pay a penalty of 10 per cent and interest at 12 per cent.

The Oregon tax law is very lenient until the last day of grace expires. Then it forces payment with heavy penalties, and unless the taxpayers of the county are now "square," it behooves them to mail payments tonight. An order mailed before 12 o'clock tonight will be honored and receipt issued without penalty.

Those who overlooked the chance to make partial payment last spring have, of course, a penalty attached already.

BRYAN TOURING IOWA.

Democrats Have Faith in Roosevelt Stump Tour Story.

Lincoln, Oct. 5.—Bryan leaves at midnight for Des Moines, on a tour of Iowa. He is taking advantage of the situation in the republican party of a state in which there is a deadlock on the senatorial contest in the legislature.

Bryan today refused to comment on the information that Roosevelt takes the stump to make six set speeches, from Washington to San Francisco. Leading democrats are ready to believe there is some truth in the story.

Democrats Mend Their Ways.

Boston, Oct. 5.—The democratic party in Massachusetts is casting out for two presidential electors to take the places of Ferdinand Strauss and Charles A. Davis, who resigned, declaring they could not vote for Bryan. Strauss has always been a democrat.

MISSOURI RATE HEARING.

Two-Cent Rate Law Will Be Tested in Missouri Courts.

Kansas City, Mo., Oct. 5.—Argument on the validity of Missouri's two-cent passenger rate law will begin today before Judge McPherson in the United States district court here. Attorney General Hadley, republican candidate for governor, who has waged a successful legal warfare against the Standard Oil company and other alleged trusts operating in this state, will defend the legality of the law. The report of an expert accountant, it is claimed, sustains the position of Hadley that the 2-cent rate is not confiscatory. The order for the hearing was made by Judge McPherson in June. It will come up on application of the railroads of Missouri, charging that the rate under the law is confiscatory. The railroads are jointly represented by Frank Hagerman of Kansas City.
