TROUBLE WITH RENT.

Postoffice Box Rent Must Be Paid More Promptly Hereafter.

Trouble and inconvenience is in store for patrons of lock boxes in the La Grande postoffice, unless a more willing spirit to pay rent on notice promptly than in the past, is demonstrated. It has always been a fact that the patrons have been lethargic in this matter, and Postmaster Richey has been hauled on the carpet by the inspector for not making the collections more promptly, or enforcing the regulations of the office if the payments are not made. According to stipulations the box rent must be paid by the first of each quarter. It has been the custom for the local office to accommodate patrons by allowing time to elapse to the extent of a week or two before forcing collections. Hereafter this must not be, not because the

office here is on the rampage, but because the department is urging the matter. Unless box rent is paid more promptly before the first of every quarter, the patron will be required to apply at the general delivery window.
