DEGREE, SAYS TRAPP JURY

MEANS IMPRISONMENT FOR LIFE, UNLESS PARDONED.

Man Who Shot and Killed Jasperson a **Huntington Found Guilty of Murder** in Second Degree-Defendant Not Affected, While Father is Deeply Touched.

After being out for about five hours the jury in the case of the State of Oregon vs. D. R. Trapp, charged with murdering Slim Jasperson at Huntington last August, reported a verdict of guilty of murder in the second degree, yesterday afternoon.

D. R. Trapp, the convicted man, showed little emotion when the verdict was read. His father broke com1 pletely down and fell upon his son's shoulder weeping most bitterly. Not a person in the court room had anything. but the greatest sympathy for the

When the verdict had been read Judge Smith announced that he would pass sentence on Trapp at 9 o'clock Saturday morning.
