pieces?" or "Will the entire contract be given to one man?" or "Will the council let the clearing of right of way to one local contractor, and the contract for digging the ditch to another, while a third be given the laying of the pipe?" All these matters will have to be threshed out.

Splendid Reserve Protection.
Though the months of careful work by J. T. Williamson, chairman of the water committee, the water project has a support at the headwaters of Beaver creek that is exceptionally pleasing. A large tract totalling 21,760 acres of land and including every inch of the Beaver creek watershed above the intake of the pipe line, has been thrown into a perpetual reserve by the government, meaning that no stock will graze on the feeders to the La Grande water supply. This feature alone has a great bearing on the project, as there will be no decrease in the supply due to clearing of underbrush and shrubbery.

Ranks as Best.

In many ways, considering sanitation and power facilities as well as supply, the project will be the best in the Pacific northwest when completed. This is the statement of engineers who have seen and investigated the plans and specifications.

Third inning—Chicago: Tinker made a three-bagger; Kling flew to center, scoring Tinker. Brown out. Schulte's two-bagger scored Kling; Chance's two-bagger scored Evers and Schulte. Steinfeldt fanned. Chicago 4.

Fourth, fifth and sixth innings—Neither of the teams scored.

Seventh inning—Devlin and McCormick singled; Bridwell walked, filling the bases. Doyle popped out; Tenney flew out; Devlin scored on the throw in; Herzog flew out. New York 1.

Thirty-three thousand paid admission at the gates.

New York, Oct. 8.—(Forenoon leased wire report.)—Early indications are that a million fans will endeavor to crowd themselves into the polo ground—in a space holding 35,000—this afternoon to witness the greatest struggle in the history of organized baseball, for the championship of the National league. The crisis has arrived after two weeks of intense suspense. Captain Chance of Chicago and his Cubs are refreshed after a three days' rest. The game this afternoon decides which team meets Detroit, the champions of the American league, for the world's championship series.

Weather Almost Perfect.

The weather is ideal; a warm sun and a light breeze cooling the bleachers which are filling rapidly, while the jam at the gate is terrific. An extra detail of 150 police, including the mounted squads, were ordered to the grounds to aid in restraining the crowds from scaling the fence. The gates will be closed long before the game starts on account of the crowds. "Christie" Mathewson will probably pitch for New York, and Pfeiffer for Chicago.

There were 25,000 in attendance at 10 o'clock. The noise made by the New York fans was terrific.

First Fight on Diamond.

Pitcher McGinnity of New York, and Captain Chance of Chicago, engaged in a fist fight before the game started. McGinnity tried to push chance off a base during practice and started the encounter. The men were separated.
