Trans-Mississippi congress today through the efforts of former Governor Pardee of California, who was lobbying against the various resolutions criticizing Chief Forester Pinchot. At today's session of the resolutions committee, Pardee won against all of Pinchot's opponents.

Last Moments Fruitful.

San Francisco, Oct. 9.—A resolution calling for a larger fleet in the Pacific ocean and for government aid for a merchant marine was reported favorably.

Opponents of the Harriman lines won their fight with the resolutions committee, when they secured the adoption of a resolution giving the interstate commerce commission power to investigate and suspend advances in freight rates before becoming operative.

Resolutions were adopted providing for the improvement and fortification of Coos Bay and Siuslaw harbor.

The convention adjourned sine die at 1 o'clock this afternoon.
