CAR LOAD OF COAL HERE

The first carload of commercial coal to arrive in La Grande, came today and put a temporary end to the coal famine that has existed for the past month. Though there is only one car of the fuel, shipped to the Grande Ronde Cash company, it gives evidence of relief and that more will be coming shortly. The Amalgamated Sugar company also received a carload for private use yesterday. Thus is given double assurance that the coal is moving towards eastern Oregon.

The railroad coal bins are amply supplied at present and the bins are beginning to show signs of storage supply.

LOCATE POWER SITE.

Pendleton Interurban System Seems to Be Progressing.

Pendleton, Oct. 18.—The East Oregonian said last night:

A water filling providing 125 cubic inches per second of time for the use of the Oregon-Washington Light & Power company, and made by E. S. Isaacs, promoter of the company, was filed for record this morning with Recorder Hendley.

The paper is of special interest in that it makes public the location of the power plant for that company, which will be built on the north bank of the Walla Walla river, about seven miles below the Skiphorton creek, at which place the water right location is made.

According to the plan as announced in the filing, Mr. Isaacs or his assigns propose to carry the water from the mouth of the Skiphorton on the south branch of the Walla Walla into the power plant, a distance of seven miles by means of a 48-inch flume to be known as the pipe line of the Oregon-Washington Light & Power company. There it is proposed to transform the water into electricity to furnish power for the proposed interurban and light and power to Walla Walla, Pendleton and other cities.

Militia for Enterprise.

A proposition to form a company of the Oregon National Guard at Enterprise is meeting with great favor among the young men of the city and surrounding country, and the outlook is that the required number, 60, will be secured without much trouble, says the News-Record. B. K. Lawson of Portland, was in the city last week and broached the subject. Mr. Lawson is a staff officer of the guard, holding the rank of lieutenant. He is in charge of the ordnance department. Four new companies are to be organized and this part of the state is entitled to one of them.

A Big Strike.

A telephone message just received from the Rainbow mine in the Mormon basin district in Malheur county, Ore., advises us of a ledge just opened showing eight feet of ore, assaying over \$400 per ton. There is a great deal of activity in the district. The Humboldt mine is installing an 800-foot hoist and will erect at once a 10-stamp mill. The International company is getting its stamp mill ready for a run and a great many claims are being located in the district.—Baker City Democrat.
