FREIGHT BILLS SHOW IT.

Shipments of Liquor Proven by Bills at Pendleton Depot. Pendleton, Oct. 9.—Freight receipts of the O. R. & N. railroad, showing that Bogart & Keegan received various shipments of liquor during the period since the local option law has been in effect in Pendleton, were brought into the case of the State vs. Bogart, Keegan and Noble this morning, when Agent Quinlan of the O. R. & N., was called upon to testify for the state.

The state rested its case shortly afternoon today when Attorney Hinkle, representing the defendants, closed a grilling cross-examination of the witness Bannister. Tom Whitney, the Thiel detective, Bannister, who accompanied him to act as witness in the transactions upon which the prosecution is based, and Mr. Quinlan were the state's only witnesses.

Whitney told of purchasing what he declared to be a mixture of ice, whiskey and ginger ale at "Billy & Dick's" on September 12, and declared that he had purchased the same concoction on other occasions. He was positive as to the whiskey being included in the mixture and testified that after drinking several similar "highballs" in various resorts along the street, he was under the influence of liquor to an appreciable extent. Bannister's evidence was corroboratory.

The defense will attack the character of the evidence and it is understood will attempt to show that the detective and his fellow worker were not wise sufficiently to pass upon the question of whether there was liquor in the concoction.
