# GEARIN TRUE DEMOCRAT

DENIES THERE ARE NO  
PARTISAN PRINCIPLES.

In Direct Contradiction of "Our George" Democratic Speaker Last Evening Affirms There is a Democratic and a Republican Party—He Wants People to Vote for Bryan Because Bryan is a Democrat—Remarkable Address for Oregon Democrat.

Senator Gearin at the opera house last evening sustained his well-earned reputation as one of the most brilliant orators within the state. The opera house was filled. It was possibly the largest political gathering that has assembled to hear a purely political partisan discussion that has met in this city since the free silver campaign, when such men as Coxe and Bryan spoke.

Unlike most democratic speakers who have visited this city, Senator Gearin did not apologize for being a democrat, but was proud of the fact and appealed to the democratic voters to vote for Mr. Bryan because Mr. Bryan was a democrat and also for the principles for which Mr. Bryan stood. In this respect it was different from the policy that has been pursued for the past four or eight years by state democratic speakers who talked "patriotism" and emphasized the fact that there was no difference any more between the two dominant parties that every voter should vote for the man—not for party. Thus it was in striking contrast to hear Senator Gearin speak out in no uncertain tones, commending party organization and party responsibility.

No one went away sore from his remarks. He stated his policy clear and strong from his standpoint and those who attended were entertained and enjoyed his address, whether they coincided with his doctrine or not.

Attorney J. D. Slater introduced the distinguished gentleman and the platform was graced with the presence of Judge Crawford, Senator Turner Oliver and Chief Train Dispatcher A. Buckley.

ENCOURAGEMENT MEETS  
SOLICITING COMMITTEE.

No one knows what good roads mean, from a standpoint of pleasure, better than the owner of an automobile, and the Commercial club will be benefited in the effort to get the convention later in the month, by the aid from the chug-chug wagon owners.

Approximately \$100 is needed to defray the expenses of bringing the speakers and educators along good roads lines, to this city.

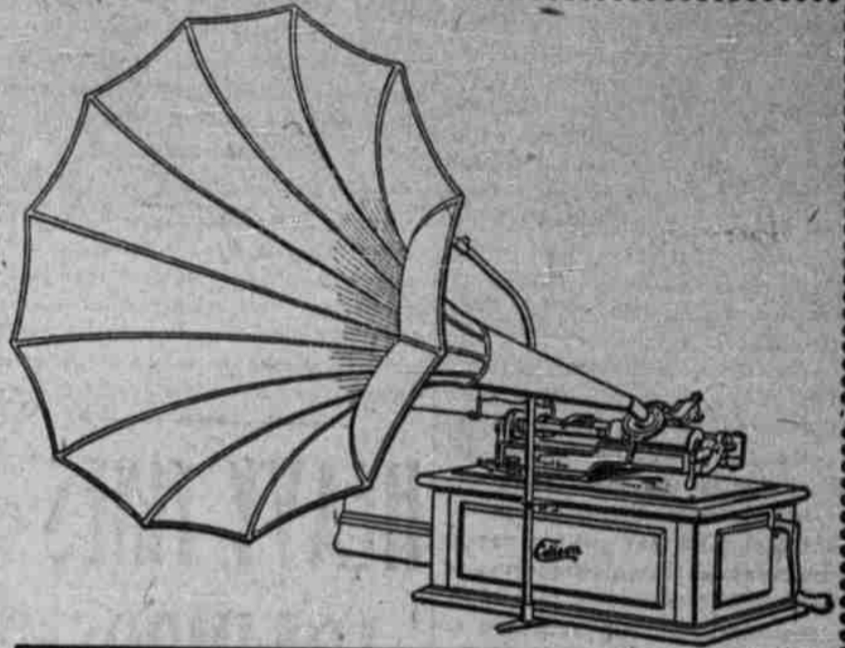
