### NEW DEPOT FEVER.

Pendleton Nurses New Rumor of Decent Depot Building Soon.

Pendleton, Oct. 14.—On a tour of inspection which may result in a new O. R. & N. depot for Pendleton, high officials of the O. R. & N. and Southern Pacific system visited Pendleton last evening.

The inspection proper was the work of the Southern Pacific men who were in the private car California. The party included General Superintendent Buckley, Division Engineer William Bollons and other officials of the Harriman lines, among whom were said to be Erastus Young, general auditor and Master Mechanic Graham of the Southern Pacific.

The inspectors went carefully over the buildings of the local station and it is rumored that their report will contain some recommendations as to a new depot. They also carefully inspected the yards and the equipment of the road here.

### BIG APPLE DEAL.

Mosier Fruit Company Disposes of 10,000 Boxes in One Order.

The Mosier Fruitgrowers' association pulled off their first big apple deal of the season today by disposing of 10,000 boxes of apples to the Davidson Fruit company of Hood River, says the Portland Oregonian. The varieties sold were Spitzenbergs, Baldwins and Red Cheeks and constitute about half the crop grown at Mosier, all of which will be handled this year by the association. The price paid for the apples is said to be fully as high as that received for the apples sold this year at Hood River, and buyers who have examined the Mosier crop say that it is the finest on the average on the coast.

### LAST OF SALOON CASES.

Umatilla Cleans Up Over a Thousand Yesterday in Fines.

Twelve hundred and fifty dollars in fines were levied by Judge Bean in the circuit court today. Of this sum \$1100 was assessed against William Bogart, Dick Keegan and their bartender, Henry Noble. The other \$150 was the amount fined George Mansfield, the Pilot Rock man, who pleaded guilty to gambling, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

Of the Bogart-Keegan fine \$250 was levied against each of the two proprietors and \$100 against the bartender on the first count, that upon which they were tried and convicted last week. On a second count to which they pleaded guilty each of the proprietors was fined \$200 and the bar man \$100. This action of Judge Bean practically disposes of the liquor question at the present term of court.
