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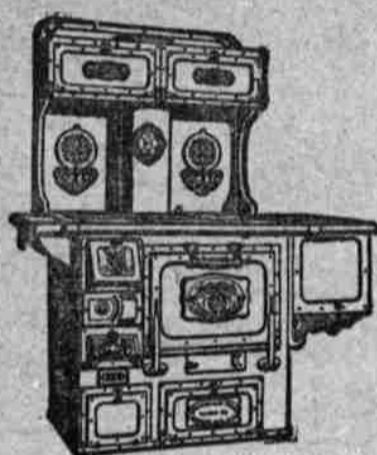

CONTRACTS FOR DEPOTS IN WALLOWA COUNTY LET

**WALLOWA TOWN WILL
HAVE FIRST STRUCTURE.**

Material Now on the Way for New Depots in Wallowa County—Buckley in Wallowa County Last Week and Promises Speedy Construction of Needed Houses.

Contracts have been awarded by Engineer Boschke for the depots at Wallowa, Lostine and Joseph, and the material for the Wallowa depot has been shipped, says the Wallowa Sun. Work will be commenced on the Wallowa depot at once. Such is the statement made by M. J. Buckley, superintendent of the operating department, who with W. W. Bollons, also of the operating department, was over the line in Mr. Buckley's private car Wednesday.

Mr. Buckley expressed himself as well pleased with the prospects of the road in this valley. The train was delayed slightly Tuesday by a bad landslide near the fish hatchery. Wednesday it was delayed by the work of the steel gang on the Grande Ronde bridge, and Mr. Buckley stated that the train would be late from the same causes both yesterday and today. After today, Mr. Buckley thinks the road will be in shape for the train to be on time every day.

"We shall have the depot up as soon as possible," said Mr. Buckley, as he was leaving. "We need it badly and it will be rushed to completion. The same contractor has contracted to build three of the depots in this valley and the Wallowa depot will be put up first. In the meantime, we shall try to secure an office in the warehouse of the Wallowa Mercantile company for the accommodation of the public."

Mr. Buckley also arranged with Mr. Brandon, of the construction department, to put in some platforms to protect the passengers from the mud.

WILL TAKE WOOLEN MILL.

Wilbur, of Union, Agree to Manage the Mill if it is Put on its Feet.

J. P. Wilbur left last evening for his home at Union, after having been here for several days in connection with the movement to reopen the Pendleton woolen mills.
