NEW POSTAGE STAMPS SOON

Washington, Oct. 20.—Uncle Sam's new series of postage stamps, to replace the designs now current, will soon be ready for distribution, and the stickers will be placed on sale at post-offices throughout the country by the last of the month or early in November. Edward Ralph, director of the bureau of Engraving and Printing, acting under the direction of Postmaster General Meyer, has produced designs for the new series which are declared by competent authorities to be the most artistic in the history of the United States postoffice department. The colors of the stamps will be the same for each denomination as those now current, and the historical characters now commemorated will not be changed. The chief departure is in the position of the faces. At present full face portraits are shown on all the stamps, but the new set will present a clear-cut profile view. Mr. Ralph is enthusiastic over the Postmaster General's design and says the stamps will be the finest ever issued by the government.
