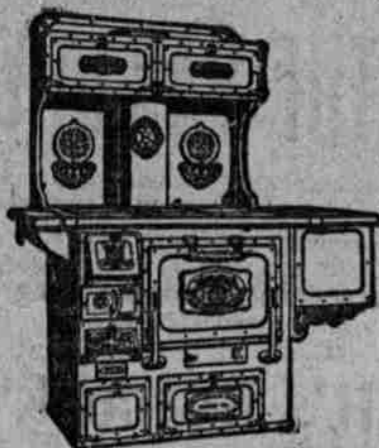

the Baldwin hall this evening, at 8
o'clock, when steps will be taken to
form a city league.

The managers of the basketball
team are anxious to get the city league
organized and as many teams will be
formed as there are men available.
The league will be composed of the
men who report for practice this eve-
ning.

At the few practices already held,
the men have turned out well and
there is much promising material at
hand for a strong regular five and also
for the teams of the city league.

There may be comparative stran-
gers in the city, who have not been
urged to report for basketball. If
there are, it is because they are un-
known. Anyone, who cares to play
the game, is earnestly requested to at-
tend the practice which will commence
at 8 o'clock.

**PROMOTERS
SEEK FUNDS**

Pendleton, Oct. 20.—Active work
towards the securing of capital to back
the woolen mill is now under way and
this afternoon those in charge declared
their belief that sufficient money can
be secured.

Previous to yesterday a half dozen
or more local people had pledged
themselves to take stock to the extent
of \$1000 each, or more. Yester-
day several others voluntarily offered
to do the same, and today two or three
other wealthy men have offered to help.

It is the intention to raise \$25,000.
This amount, it is figured, will be
needed to purchase the machinery and
to serve as an operating fund.

T. C. Taylor has taken up the work
of organizing the company and it is
hoped and also believed that within a
few days ample money for the enter-
prise will have been secured.

This afternoon J. P. Wilbur and
wife went to Athena to visit with the
latter's uncle, T. J. Kirk. They will
return tomorrow and will probably re-
turn to Union in the evening. How-
ever, should his services be needed
here, Mr. Wilbur says he will remain
until the work of financing the enter-
prise is completed.

As soon as sufficient money is se-
cured for the purchase and operation
of the mill, a formal proposition for
the purchase of the plant will be sub-
mitted to the Judds.
