taken precedence over questions of national importance. Local option and prohibition of the liquor traffic have played a more important part in the contests in many states than ever before. In most of the states, however, neither party has been able to secure the political apathy with which the people generally seem to be afflicted.

**New York an Exception.**  
A few states afford striking exceptions to the rule. In New York the effort to defeat Governor Hughes for re-election has attracted national attention. In their excitement over the contest between Hughes and Chanler the people of New York have seemingly forgotten the presidential contest. In Illinois the gubernatorial contest between Deneen and Stevenson likewise overshadows the race between Bryan and Taft. The same thing seems to be true of several other states, notably West Virginia, Indiana and Minnesota.

Japan enthusiastically endorses calling the oriental conference and will aid in bringing it about. A powerful association is being formed by most influential scholars and public men, to bring Japan and America to a closer understanding of the problems of the orient, under an agreement which might be known as the Japan-American alliance. Through this association it is probable the proposition to call a conference of England, America and Japan will be brought officially before the government. I wish to express through the United Press, to the people of the United States, the great pleasure the visit of the fleet has given Japan. Extend to them my kindest regards and the friendship of the Japanese.

After five machines were smashed in the terrific speed contest, Robertson reached the line first. Lytle, in an Isotta car, was second. The officials declared the race finished. Robertson covered 250 miles in 4 hours and 48 seconds.

**Postmaster Lachner Speaks.**  
Yesterday afternoon Postmaster Lachner delivered two lectures, one to the teachers and higher grades at St. Francis academy, and the last one to the high school pupils at the high school. The subject of each lecture was the "Organization and Functions of the Postoffice Department." On September 28 the postmaster general issued a general order to all postmasters, requesting and urging them to co-operate with the heads of the school children in the organization and operations of the postoffice department, and particularly about the proper classification and addressing of mail matter, and the functions and practical application of the registry and money order systems.—Baker City Herald.
