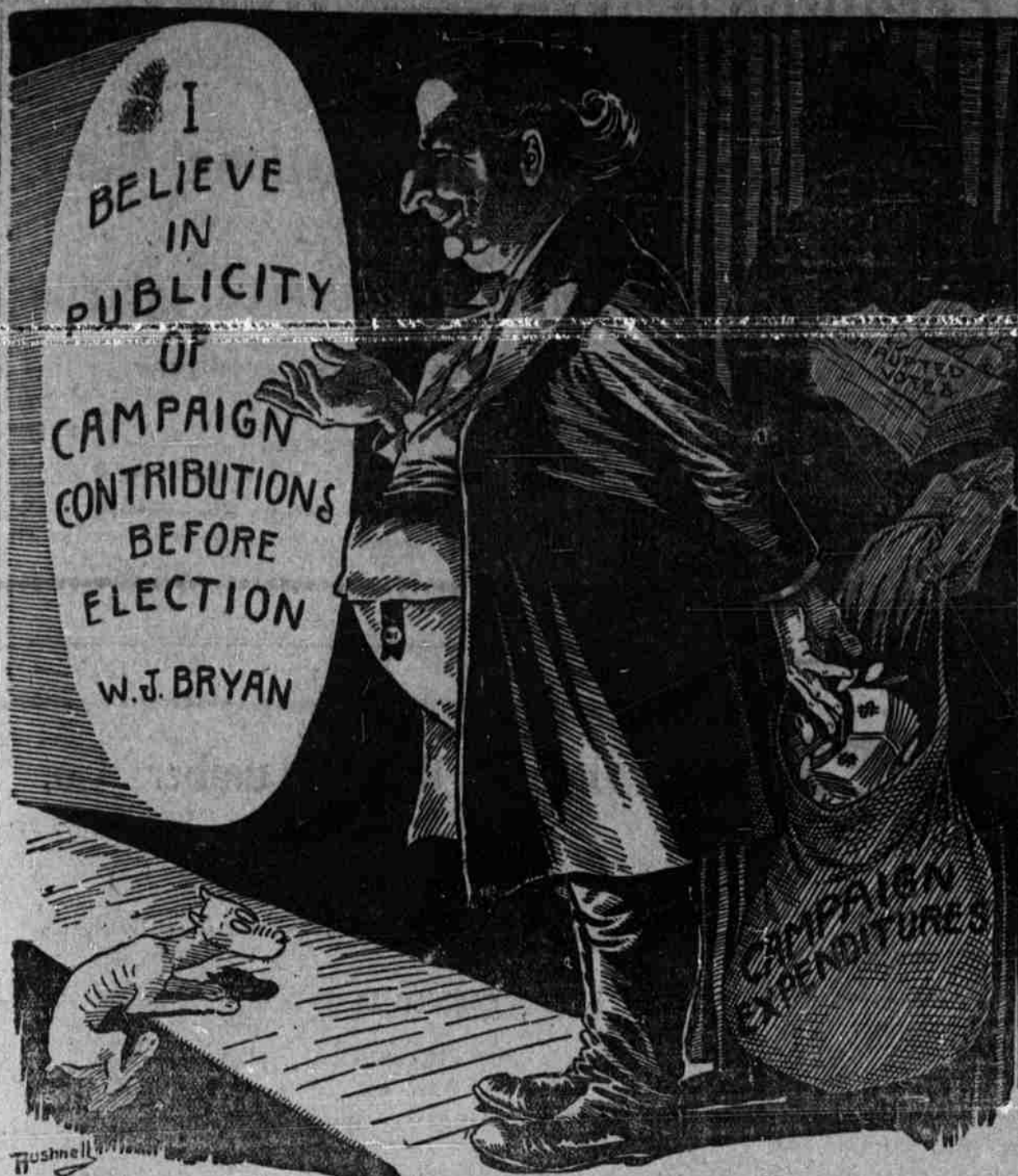


Turn the Light on the Other Hand, Mr. Bryan!

## KEEP PUPILS IN ORCHARDS

FLAGRANT DISREGARD OF PRESENT SCHOOL LAWS.

Twenty-five Pupils Missing From School This Morning—Located in Apple Orchards—Heavy Fine for Employing Children of School Age—Orders to Arrest.

Superintendent H. J. Hockenberry donned his war paint this morning when the school records showed that there were between 20 and 25 students missing. An investigation found the cause to be in the apple orchards. Apple season will in most instances, last several weeks, and those who remain out the full time will be so far behind that only a few will be able to keep up with their classes.

Superintendent Hockenberry instructed Truant Officer I. W. Faulk to arrest the employers of school children. The law imposes a fine of \$300 upon all who do work without a certificate from the state factory inspector. If the law is enforced it will result in a lot of children going to school instead of picking apples. The next few days will tell the results accomplished.

## SUCCESSOR HERE SOON

As yet nothing has been made public as to who will succeed G. C. Osburn as local manager for the Pacific States Telephone company when he goes to Portland to assume his duties as traveling auditor. While Mr. Osburn presumes the appointment of his successor has been made, he has not been advised of it. He expects the new man here in a few days.

## TOTALS SHOW TAFT LEADS IN UNION

COUNTY STRONGLY REPUBLICAN BY REGISTRATION.

Complete Totals Received Today Show Union County to Be Republican by 944 Plurality—Reader Can Interpret Figures to His Liking, But If Registration Counts for Aught, Taft Will Carry County by Nice Figure—The Total List.

Herewith we give a detailed statement of the registration of Union county, which totals 3815. We hear much these days about no political ties or faith, but of this total only 35 declined to affiliate with any party. The republican party leads with a plurality over the democratic party of 944. The socialist party is credited with 172, the prohibition party with 55, and the independence league with 165. Here are the figures and you political prophets can read the results to suit yourself. There is no question but what Taft will carry Union county by a handsome majority.

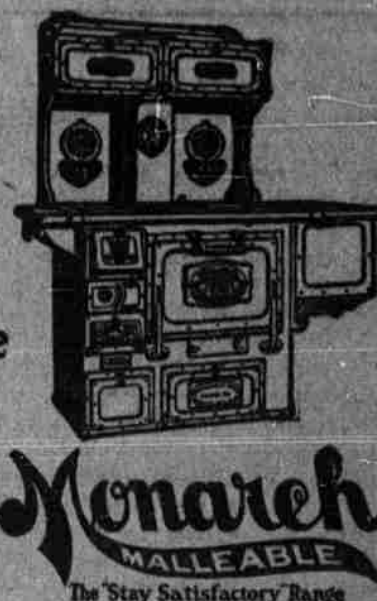
