RELEASED YET JAILED

Pomeroy, Oct. 26.—After deliberating for more than six hours, the jury in the M. O. Fitzmaurice libel case, in which Fitzmaurice is charged with writing a libelous article, by an attack on the Columbia County Standard, entitled "A Notorious Stock Rustler," returned a verdict of not guilty. Immediately following the acquittal of the editor of the Columbia County Standard, a warrant was sworn out by Prosecuting Attorney A. A. Kirby, and Fitzmaurice was re-arrested on a perjury charge.

Kirby claims that two days prior to the publication of the alleged slanderous article entitled "A Notorious Stock Rustler," Fitzmaurice had told him in Spokane that he was going to publish the article. On the witness stand during the recent trial the editor is said to have denied this statement in a sworn affidavit.

F. W. D. Mays, who was recently convicted of writing the libelous article in which he asserted that Kirby was a retained attorney of the O. R. & N. company while he was filling the office of prosecuting attorney. He was convicted and fined \$1 on the last charge.

Fitzmaurice is held in the county jail to await a second trial, which will likely come off within the next few days.

"Whacker" Shot by Thug.

Walla Walla, Oct. 26.—Drawing back his lantern to strike a hold-up man who had ordered him to throw up his hands, Car Checker Williams of the P. E. was shot and probably fatally wounded by a bandit at Pasco last night, according to word brought to the city this morning. Williams was engaged in checking up the cars in the yard when he encountered the highwayman. The command to elevate his hands served to arouse Williams' combativeness and as he drew back to hit the man, the latter fired, the bullet penetrating Williams' lung.

NEIDNER IN CHARGE

NEW RECEIVER OF F. & T. HAS TAKEN POSSESSION.

Walter Neidner Arrives This Morning to Take Charge of Bank—Is Professional Untangler of Crooked Banks—Gatch Will Remain in La Grande a Few Days Pending Final Turn-over of Affairs—Neidner Came From Bisbee Today.

Walter Neidner, professional untangler of crooked banks, arrived this morning to supersede Claude Gatch, who retires from the receivership of the suspended Farmers & Traders National bank by his own request. Mr. Neidner lives at St. Louis when he is at home, but for the past four years he has been in the employ of the comptroller of the currency, devoting his entire time to straightening out such cases as now exist in this city. For many years he has been connected with banks and banking, and is well qualified for the responsible position he holds.

He came here from Bisbee, Ariz., where a national bank was in similar straits to the Farmers & Traders.

Gatch to Leave Soon. Claude Gatch, the national bank examiner, will remain in La Grande for a few days to complete the turn-over of affairs. When this is done, he will take his departure for other fields that are congested, due to his extended stay in La Grande.
