DEPUTY WAS AT FAULT

Scriber has been taking desperate chances and hoping for a lucky turn on property he had secured in order to make his losses good.

"Scriber's is not the only wreck of a happy home in that county. There are many, many others. The failure of the bank has wiped out every cent owned by many people over there. I know of one old man and his wife who had \$12,000 in that bank, and haven't a penny except what they can get out of the wreck. There are others, too.

"In my opinion Scriber is not sorry to leave La Grande," continued Mr. Hammersley, "and I am not so sure but that it is a good thing for him that he did. Each day sees some new evidence come to light and the people are highly worked up over the case. I brought him down last evening because that was my original plan, but after I reached La Grande I was glad I had so arranged, because if I had waited until this morning I was told that there might very likely have been a big demonstration of those who had suffered through his forgeries, at the depot. It seems that only lack of a leader has saved Scriber from violence at the hands of the depositors so far.

If the statement regarding the parting scene is no more correct than the reported interview with Deputy Hammersley, issued by the Associated Press from Portland, which in effect was that he flew into La Grande and spirited Mr. Scriber away just in time to save his life from infuriated citizens Mr. C. J. Scriber has a just criticism coming, but not at The Observer. Cashier Scriber was on our streets daily since the closing of the bank, but at no time was his life in danger, nor was there any semblance of a demonstration.

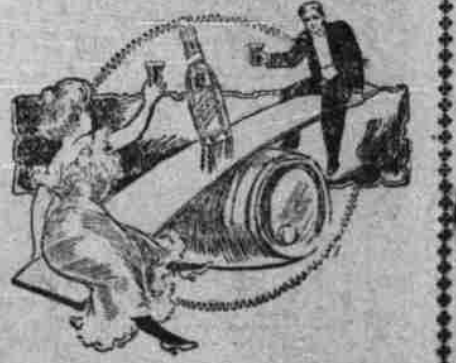
