Enterprise Commercial Club Will Hold Its Feast Later On.

Owing to delay in completion of the railroad to Enterprise, the banquet planned for November 2 has been indefinitely postponed. A letter from the Enterprise Commercial club states that due announcement will be made of the affair, which has not been dropped, but postponed to conform with existing conditions.

PROFITABLE PRUNE BUSINESS.

Union and Cove Dryers Will Handle 7500 Boxes of Prunes.

The Union and Cove fruit dryers have been running since the third of the month and expect to complete the work of drying prunes by the last of next week. Mr. Lasalle, who is in charge of the work, estimates that the two dryers will handle this year 7500 boxes of prunes—about 45,000 pounds in all, or in the neighborhood of 100 tons of dried prunes, or about 200,000 pounds of the finished product. After drying comes grading, packing and shipping, which will take probably two weeks more. The two dryers have employed about 13 men in all, to the shift, running two shifts a portion of the time, the Union shift requiring 11 men. Mr. Lasalle reports a good prospect for an active demand for dried fruit this fall and winter. He is already selling some at Boise, the closest point of sale for some time. —Union Republican.

AT WORK ON DEPOT.

New Structure at Wallowa is Well Advanced This Week.

Work on the Wallowa depot was begun last Friday and has been rushed rapidly forward during the past week. Fisher & Patrie of Portland, have the contract, according to the Wallowa Sun.

The structure will be two stories high and will be 24x30 in size, while the platform will be of equal size. It will contain commodious rooms for the transaction of all railroad business.

The contractors expect to have the roof on next week and state that the structure will be completed by another crew, all work being completed before Thanksgiving time. The same contractors have the contract for the depots at Enterprise and Joseph. The railroad company has agreed to have the material ready for them at Enterprise by the middle of next month, at which time the depot at that place will be begun.
